Keeping You Informed by Teri Sloan, Town Administrator

Update of September 2, 2008 Town Council meeting:

1. Council made the following special presentations:
 - a. Presented Zachary Sahms with a Community Service Award for painting the trash receptacles downtown.
 - b. Presented Pete & Jo McConnell with a Community Service Award for painting the planters downtown.
2. Council agreed to allow Pete McConnell to build a privacy fence to “clean up” the equipment and garbage storage area at Farmers Hall.
3. Council accepted a Recommendation from the Planning Commission to amend the Zoning Ordinance regarding the replacement of Article VI: Town Appearance Commission
4. Council adopted the following Ordinances for second and final reading.
 - a. “An Ordinance to Amend Section 205.39 of the Zoning Ordinance Concerning the Definition of “Family”.
 - b. “An Ordinance to amend the Planned Development called “The Villages at Town Creek,” formerly known as “Pendleton Station,” per Major Changes to the Site Plan and Descriptive Booklet for Phase 1A (19.21 acres) and Concept Plan for Phase 1B, zoned PDMU, within the site located at 621 Lebanon Road (TMS# 63-00-01-006 & 63-00-01-007)

The next Town Council meeting will be held Monday, October 6, 2008, 7pm in the Council Chambers of Town Hall. Everyone is invited to attend!
