

BOIL WATER ADVISORY

Lebanon Rd., Maxwell Ave., Wellford Dr., Seawright Dr., Magnolia Ln., and Long Rd.

Town of Pendleton Public Works is issuing a **BOIL WATER ADVISORY – UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE effective September 22, 2026 @ 12:07PM.**

The advisory affects the following areas outlined in yellow on the map below and includes Lebanon Rd., Maxwell Ave., Wellford Dr., Seawright Dr., Magnolia Ln., and Long Rd.



The Town of Pendleton has issued a Boil Water Advisory due to an incident involving an outside contractor who inadvertently clipped a water line. The incident resulted in reduced/no water pressure while repairs to the water line were made. Residents may notice increased sediment or discoloration in their water as crews work to flush the affected water lines. Fire hydrants will be opened during the flushing process to help clear the lines and restore water quality.

WATER SHOULD BE VIGOROUSLY BOILED FOR AT LEAST ONE FULL MINUTE PRIOR TO DRINKING OR COOKING AND ANY ICE MADE FROM WATER THAT HAS NOT BEEN BOILED SHOULD NOT BE USED FOR DRINKING PURPOSES.

Residents may experience temporary discoloration or sediment in their water. If this occurs:

- Run your COLD water tap until the water runs clear.
- Do not use hot or warm water until the cold water is clear, as sediment can be drawn into your water heater and potentially cause damage.
- Avoid washing laundry until your water has cleared to prevent possible staining.

Customers will be notified through email blast, social media and at www.townofpendleton.org when the problem has been resolved, and there is no longer a need to boil water.
